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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

The first day of term is always an exciting one. When observing the children enter the school grounds they always come in with a big smile and an eagerness to connect with friends and teachers who they haven't seen for two weeks. The front playground is a buzz with chatter describing the adventures of the previous two weeks. The children are refreshed and ready to face new learning challenges.

On July 16 our Catholic community celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This feast day tends to fall in the holidays and our school celebrates this feast during our first Mass in Term 3.

There are four significant associations with our Carmelite charism.

The Prophet Elijah - Elijah is a minor prophet in the Old Testament, he was alive around 900BC for a period of some 50-60 years. Elijah means "My Lord is Yahweh". The story of Elijah can be found in the first Book of Kings, Chapters 1 and 2. In the New testament at the Transfiguration of Jesus on Mt Tabor, Elijah and Moses were also present. Elijah as a connection with the Word of God, Moses as a connection with the Law of God and Jesus as the new covenant promised as Messiah. Elijah used the caves on Mt Carmel to live in and pray in. Elijah is the major patron of the Carmelite Order.

Mount Carmel - Mount Carmel is a well known ridge in Palestine. Mount Carmel is not mentioned in the New Testament but is often referenced in the Old Testament. There are many caves in the Carmel Range and these caves were used by hermits to become closer to God. Today Mt Carmel rises above the modern city of Haifa, the Church of Stella Maris sits atop the mountain and inside the Church is one of the caves believed to be where Elijah prayed. About ten minutes away are the ruins of a 12th century Carmelite monastery.

St Simon Stock - was born 1165 in England. It is said that when he was twelve years old he began to live as a hermit in the hollow trunk of an oak and later to have become an itinerant preacher until he entered the Carmelite Order which had just come to England. According to the same tradition he went as a Carmelite to Rome and from there to Mt. Carmel, where he spent several years. Under the leadership of St Simon Stock the Carmelite Order had significant growth across Europe. Mary, the Mother of God appeared to St Simon Stock and gave him the brown scapular to increase devotion to Her Son across the world.

The Brown Scapular - the brown scapular is a part of our rich Catholic tradition. It is a sign of the devotion of Carmelites to Our Lady of Mount Carmel and her Son; and it is a sign of Our Lady of Mount Carmel's love for and protection of the order that honors her as sister, mother, and queen. The brown scapular is worn under our clothing as a personal act of devotion. On Friday our Parents and Friend's Association will be giving each child the gift of a brown scapular to celebrate our feast.

SPOTLIGHT ON RE

This term Stage 3 are continuing trialling the new RE curriculum using the inquiry approach to teaching/learning. Year 6 are focussing on Stewardship and Our Responsibility and the Earth while year 5 will be inquiring into the Apostolic Church. The response to last terms trial has been very positive from the children as learners, parents and teachers. All are finding that the learnings and responses are at a greater depth of knowledge and there is more engagement from children because they have a choice in the direction each learning cycle takes. Each of the new cycles have six elements as a foundation... student voice, centered on Jesus, inquiry learning and teaching practices, tradition statements of our Church, mission and transferring and applying these learnings to our lives.

K-6 INDIGENOUS CULTURAL EXPERIENCE

Even though NAIDOC celebrations were held during the first week of the holidays, we will be holding our own NADIDOC celebration this Thursday 25 July. Our day will begin with a smoking ceremony at 10:30am-11am to cleanse the environment and promote wellbeing for semester two. All families are invited to share in this experience.
