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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

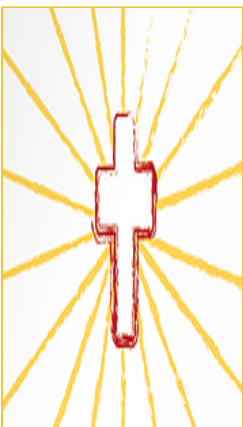
Dear Parents,

MONDAY ASSEMBLY - PARENTS WELCOME TO RETURN

Today, families will receive a letter outlining new procedures for parent involvement at school in light of the recent changes to restrictions. From next week, parents and carers will be able to attend Monday Morning Assembly under these procedures:

- Parents will be asked to wait at the Smith St gate for a staff member to invite you to enter.
- Parents will need to sit/stand in the designated areas, with a 1.5m distance between all adults.
- Parents will not be able to approach their child's class.
- Parents will be asked to leave the school grounds at the conclusion of assembly, before the children move to class

STUDENT ILLNESS - COVID RESTRICTIONS STILL APPLY

While restrictions around family engagement with school life have eased, protocols surrounding student illness remain unchanged.

- Students and staff are not to attend school if they are unwell. This includes a runny nose or sore throat.
- Students and staff who are absent from school with flu like symptoms, or, who have been sent home because they have flu-like symptoms **must have a COVID-19 test**
- Students and staff are not able to return to school **until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom-free**
- **A negative COVID-19 test result must be provided to the school** before a student can come back to school. The test results can be a NSW Health or COVID-19 Testing Centre letter, SMS or email and/or a medical certificate

We also understand these processes may be frustrating, however in order to protect the health and safety of all we are required to follow them. Thank you for being respectful to school staff who call to ask for a child to be collected.

KINDERGARTEN 2022 ENROLMENTS

The 2022 Kindergarten enrolment period has commenced with the first enrolment packs already being collected **AND RETURNED**. Prospective parents can collect enrolment information from the office, with all completed documentation returned by **THURSDAY 1 APRIL**. Due to current restrictions, we will be holding three Open Afternoons for families to attend. **These are scheduled for THIS FRIDAY, 26th March and 7th May 2020, beginning at 4pm**

All orders for uniforms should be placed using the Qkr app by 4pm on a Tuesday so that delivery can take place on a Thursday. The last day for ordering this term will be Tuesday 30 March. Students must wear their winter uniform from the beginning of Term 2.

This session provided parents with information about the NAPLAN Online process and how we all can best help our child prepare for NAPLAN.



ARE YOUR CONTACT DETAILS UP TO DATE

There are occasions where teachers or school staff need to phone parents or emergency contacts. This is hindered when the details we have on file are incorrect. We ask all parents to inform the school if you have changed any of your phone numbers since you enrolled your youngest child. Don't forget to update the numbers of your emergency contacts too. If you are unsure that your details are correct please email the school and we will let you know the details we have on file.
