As you know 2022 is our centenary year. Each term our students are delving into our past to learn more about our 100 year story. This term we are embarking on a project to document our history. Our project is called.....

CHILDREN ATTENDING SCHOOL WITH ILLNESS

We are urging parents to be extremely vigilant and **refrain from sending their child to school, even if they have the slightest of symptoms**. Since returning from the holiday break we have had to send numerous children home before 10am. We are told more often than not, that our students tell their parents that they are unwell and their parents are saying, "go to school and see how you feel and I can come and pick you up". If your child is sick, please keep them home. When you send your child to school, knowing they are unwell, you increase the risk to other students, staff and all families. Sick children attending school is likely to impact the health of other students and staff. Staff who fall ill, even with a cough, runny nose or sore throat, aren't able to come to work, which means your child doesn't have their regular teacher and regular learning. Don't forget, just like your children, staff aren't able to attend until they are symptom free, which means your child could be without their teacher for a few days. We ask all families to do the right thing and keep children who are sick at home, don't risk it.

We know this continues to be challenging for families, however, this is one of our vital safety measures which significantly reduces the risk of infection spread.

- Students who are absent from school or who have been sent home due to flu like symptoms **must have a PCR test or RAT**
- **Even if** your child receives a negative result they **ARE NOT** to return to school unless they are symptom free.
- If a student is sent home from school with Covid19 symptoms, **siblings will also be sent home with them**

POSSIBLE COVID19 SYMPTOMS

- headache
- loss of smell or loss of taste
- loss of appetite
- recent onset blocked nose
- conjunctivitis
- fever of 37.5C or more or a history suggestive of fever (night sweats, chills)
- an acute respiratory infection (e.g. cough, shortness of breath, sore throat)
- scratchy throat
- muscle pains and/or joint pain
- runny nose
- nausea
- vomiting or diarrhoea
- fatigue
- Students **must not return to school until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom-free**
- Parents are expected to communicate, via email or phone call, the results of this test **BEFORE** the student returns to school
- When you are entering your child's absence via COMPASS, please provide a specific reason so that we know why your child is home. If you write 'cold and flu symptoms', we will know to also expect a follow up RAT or PCR result. However, if you were to write 'visiting the doctor for a possible fractured finger', we wouldn't expect any testing and no follow up would be needed.
