PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

As a child I attended a Catholic primary school and the motto of my primary school has been a lifelong influence. The motto was *'Love One Another'*. This simple phrase was one of the key lessons of Jesus' teachings. As I listened to last week's Gospel reading from St Luke I thought back to my school motto and considered what this meant to me.

In this reading, St Luke opens by telling us to love our enemies, pray for those who treat you badly, turn your cheek, treat others the way you wish to be treated. He goes on to say that even sinners love those who love them. Instead, love your enemies and do good without the expectation of reward. In these words, he is revealing what God is like and how he acts to those who are good and bad - as a loving God to all, who loves unconditionally. We are invited to do what we can to emulate the love of God. Showing love to those we love is easy. How can we show unconditional love, acceptance and generosity to those we don't love? This is most challenging, but Luke gives us some clear proposals on how to achieve this.

you fill our hearts with love: Christ,
through you we are saved:
may our hearts be filled with compassion and love
for those who would do us wrong.
We ask this through Christ our Lord
Amen***
