PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

Today marks the beginning of Lent. The word 'Lent' comes from the Anglo-Saxon word for Spring, which mirrors the season that is beginning in the Northern Hemisphere where life is regenerating and blooming. For us in the Southern Hemisphere, the seasons are reversed and we have to adapt the symbolism. After the heat of Summer, perhaps we can pray for the grace of God's Spirit to come with the gentle Autumn rains to purify and refresh our hearts.

During Mass today Fr Martinho asked the children to identify the difference between Lent and Advent. Yasemin responded saying that Lent was about sacrifice while Advent was about preparing. This idea of sacrifice was picked up by Fr Martinho when he described it as...

'Sacrifice to receive spiritual gifts'

Lent isn't simply about giving things up. In our new Religious Education syllabus we will be looking how we can go 'deeper'. So as we think of our Lenten promises we can consider what we can do to give of ourselves to make a difference. Today the children sang the following words that encourage us to go deeper and follow in Jesus' way....
