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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

Sometimes we encounter concepts in the Scriptures that confuse us or we find difficult to make sense of. For me, one of these concepts is presented in the Gospel reading this week that tells of *the transfiguration of Christ*. So just like the children of OLMC I did some research and turned to someone who could help me. Here is what I found out:

I started looking for definitions and learnt that *transfiguration* means to transform or to change into another form. It also means to change the outside to match the inside. I made the connection with the word metamorphosis which we commonly associate with the transformation of a caterpillar into a butterfly.

So the next thing I did was to then ask a person who I knew could help me.... Mrs Nolan. She helped me to understand that what occurs in this transfiguration is that the human Jesus, who was always divine, revealed His divinity to His beloved disciples. Up until this point Jesus' divine nature was hidden in his human form. This revelation takes place in the presence of three disciples who stood as human witnesses to the divine glory that was Christ's. There were also three heavenly witnesses, Moses (the lawmaker), Elijah (the prophet) and the voice of God from heaven saying '*This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!*' According to Old Testament law, three earthly and divine witnesses are required to attest to any fact, therefore legitimising this experience.



Mrs Nolan has often spoken about the symbolic links between the Old and New Testaments and this is an example of that link between the covenant made in the Old Testament and the

renewal of the promises with Jesus in the New Testament. This covenant defines the relationship between Christian believers and God.

The transfiguration of Jesus that the disciples experienced was not simply something they were to see and experience as happening to Jesus alone. It was also an invitation for them to undergo a transfiguration of their own. This then leads my thinking to ponder what this transfiguration means for me. It calls us to listen to Jesus and all that He invites us to be and do, however much it may seem to go against the conventions of the world we live in. It means having total trust in walking Jesus' way and that this will bring us into full union with God as the source of truth, love, happiness and peace.

So we try to live the words God spoke to the disciples....

'This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!'

FAQs: *My child is from another Rite (Maronite/Melkite/Coptic, etc), can they still celebrate with their friends?* Your child's baptism certificate would be your first point of reference; it tells you which sacraments your child received. Baptism and Confirmation are one-off sacraments, they are not repeated, but Holy Communion can be received every day. Talk to your child about their faith background, about the beauty and richness of those traditions. If you'd like your child to have greater understanding of the sacrament, you're welcome to enrol them in the process and attend workshops. If they've already been Confirmed and received their first Holy Communion at baptism, they're welcome to celebrate with their friends as guests.
