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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

News of recent events in Christchurch has shocked us all. In a community not too dissimilar to our own here in Western Sydney, a group of faith-filled Muslim people had gathered together in their weekly prayer and contemplation lost their lives through a horrible act of violence. This event has irrevocably changed the lives of many and impacted their lives in ways that we can never know. We also hope that we should never have to experience this level of devastation and sorrow.

We live in a society where media and political attention is often focused on the negative aspects of communities and inflaming messages designed to raise fear. It gives the false perception that the communities we live in are unsafe, when in fact it is quite the opposite. What we fail to hear are the stories of how our multicultural communities live in harmony, cooperation and tolerance.

However, since the news of the attack on the mosque, we have heard of the humanity and unity of those in Christchurch and beyond who have offered their support in both a physical and spiritual presence. We have witnessed how through the power of compassionate and heartfelt words Jacinda Ardern has been able to give comfort and unite a grief-stricken country. **"We are one. They are us."**

"We are a community of believers whose lives are shaped and formed by Jesus' messages of love, tolerance and compassion. These values make us who we are. The worldwide outpouring of support from people of all faiths (and no faith) for the victims and their families reminds us that we are not alone and that at the heart of everything is an overwhelming desire to belong and care for each other."

To those who have lost people they loved and who loved them, we offer our prayers.

May the God of everlasting love walk alongside them and stay with them always.

To the victims, eternal rest grant them O Lord, and may perpetual light shine upon them.

May they rest in peace. Amen.

Children in Kindy to Year 2 are required to experience 30 books, whilst children in Year 3 to Year 6 are required to independently read 20 books from the challenge list.
