# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

# Dear Parents,

This week our children in Year 3 and Year 5 have been participating in the 2019 NAPLAN assessments. Each year this period always brings a range of feelings for children and parents. We always want our children to do their best in all their endeavours and NAPLAN is just one of these. It is important to remember that your child's achievement in NAPLAN is just one small chapter in the very detailed story of your child's life.

Throughout our life we will face many tests and challenges, at this time for our children, NAPLAN presents one of these moments. Sometimes we need to work hard under pressure. Sometime we will need to perform to a standard or complete tasks within a set time and we will be evaluated on it. These moments will make us feel a certain level or stress or worry, and we will need to sit with this discomfort. But by being prepared and doing our best we learn that those feelings will pass and life goes on.

On Tuesday after completing the writing test I asked the children how they felt. The children overwhelmingly responded that they felt they performed well. They also said that the experience was better than they thought it would be. Through this experience and our conversations the children are discovering how to get on with things and put them into perspective. This lesson in resilience is an important one for our children.

A sense of perspective helps us to identify the proper place of NAPLAN and other tests that we experience. *Our children are so much more* than their NAPLAN result, their report mark, their rugby score or the instrument they play! They are the effort they put in to a task; the picture the drew; the curiosity they followed chasing that bird; or the kind hearted offer extended in an invitation to play.

So as you send your child off to school during this NAPLAN period, wish them well and remind them that they just need to try their best and that you love them.



Sadly Anthony the brother of our students Gabby (Year 4) and Olivia (Year 1) needs to have a heart transplant. The family have had to relocate to Melbourne to receive treatment for Anthony until he is able to have a transplant. As you would be aware the health care cost of this procedure are significant. We pray for the family and that Anthony's treatment is successful.


# **OLMC LITTLE FREE LIBRARY**

Marie - Jose: I learnt that bushrangers were not only good but bad too because they used to steal gold and kill people, including police officers, for their gold/money.


Sanjana: I learnt that people went crazy when they found there was gold hidden underground
