EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

An important part of our Work Health and Safety requirements is the practising of emergency procedures. It is essential that we practise these procedures so the children, staff and parents know what to do if we need to lock down or evacuate the school. This coming Friday we will be practising an Off-Site Evacuation Drill. Our off-site evacuation location is Wentworthville Public School. We have been planning the procedures with the leadership team at Wentworthville Public who will be prepared to accommodate us on their school grounds. Our Lady of Mount Carmel will also be the off-site evacuation location for Wentworthville Public School. Should we ever have to evacuate the school all parents will be notified via text message and the Skoolbag app. This is another reason for parents to ensure that all contact details are up-to-date.

Please ensure that your child has returned their permission slip so that we are aware of the pickup arrangements for every student. If no arrangements are made your child will return to school with their teacher.


All students will be travelling to the venue by bus and no parent is permitted on the bus with the children. If you can assist on the day please let Mr Jones know.


