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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

This week children in our faith community are receiving their first Sacrament of Reconciliation. This Sacrament marks the beginning of our conscious decision to take up the promises made at our Baptism by our Godparents and complete our Catholic Sacraments of Initiation. Last night the first group of children completed their first reconciliation.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an opportunity for us to reflect on our thoughts and actions and recall times where we have not been our best. We seek forgiveness through a conversation and prayer with our priests who stand in for Jesus in this conversation of counsel and forgiveness. As the children prepared to receive this sacrament they reflected on the story of The Forgiving Father which some of us may know as The Prodigal Son. They were also lead through an examination of conscious which is shared below:

There was a man who had two sons, and the younger one wanted his share of the property. When he left, he wasted all his money.

When have I been wasteful? When have I used more than I need?

He had spent everything, when a bad famine spread through that whole land. Soo he had nothing to eat.

Do I turn a blind eye to the suffering of others? How do I feel when I neglect the needs of others?

He decided to return to his father.

What does it take for me to turn to God? Do I include God in the choices I make?

When he returned, his father celebrated with great joy. But the older brother became mad.

> When do I get Jealous? How do I feel after I take out my bad moods on others?

The father called for the older son to join in the celebrations, but he was too mad.

When am I less than gentle with people? Can I let go of grudges that I hold?

Sometimes as our children prepare to receive their sacraments we can be caught up in the superficial elements of our clothes, the celebrations or even just doing it with our friends. Our sacraments are a time for us to connect with the spiritual element of our conscious and reflect individually and as a family on how being a Catholic guides our lives. These are sacred moments in our lives where we can strengthen our relationship with God. I encourage you to take a few moments and reflect on the statements above just as the children in our parish have.
