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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

Yesterday I had the privilege of attending the annual Diocesan Education Mass along with Mrs Nolan, four of our student leaders, Elisha, Claudia, Bradley and Gevin as well as some of their parents. This Mass was celebrated at St Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop Vincent. For the children this was their first experience of a formal Mass at the cathedral and certainly their first opportunity to meet and talk with Bishop Vincent.

After greeting the children Bishop Vincent asked the children about our school. He noticed our school emblem and pointed out the latin words *Sub Tuum Praesidium*. These are words that most of us take for granted or are completely unaware of their meaning. The latin words of our motto mean *Under Your Protection*.

We fly to thy protection, O holy Mother of God; Despise not our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O glorious and blessed Virgin Sub tuum praesidium cofugimus, Sancta Dei Genetrix. Nostras deprecationes ne despicias in necessitatibus nostris, sed a periculis cunctis libera nos semper, Virgo gloriosa et benedicta.

Sub tuum praesidium is the oldest preserved and surviving hymn to the Blessed Virgin Mary as Mother of God. Scholars date this prayer back to the mid third century, which shows that there was a common belief and reverence within the early church recognising Mary as both Virgin and as the Mother of God. This simple hymn is a part of the traditions or Catholic and Orthodox religions. It is also often sung in Marist schools and groups around the world.

We can use this simple prayer to call on Mary our mother to guide and protect us as we go about living our lives.

Sports Update

It has been a busy start to Term 3 with a number of sporting events taking place over the first couple of weeks. OLMC sent four teams to the Stage 2 Soccer Gala Day, a squad of 40 students to the Zone Athletics Carnival and students in Years 3-6 have been participating in an NRL clinic on Wednesdays. It has been all systems go and seeing so many students getting involved and enjoying these experiences is what we hope continues into the back end of the year.



The Stage 2 Soccer Gala Day saw OLMC send four teams to participate on the day, a boys team from each of Years 3 and 4 and for the first time ever a girls team from each of these years. It was an early start out at Jamison Park in Penrith on a cold Tuesday morning but that didn't seem to affect the OLMC students as it turned out to be a very successful day! Three out of the four teams went on to win their pool on the day! A special mention to the Year 3 girls team who did not concede a goal all day! By all reports from Mrs Kirby and Mrs Haddad the boys and girls who competed on the day represented our school exceptionally well and are already looking forward to competing again next year.

The 2019 Zone Athletics Carnival was another very successful day for OLMC in week 3. 40 students from Years 2-6 travelled out to Blacktown International Sports Park to compete in both track and field events. The day started out well with the Junior Girls Relay Team (Jasmine, Serena, Isabella, Rouba) qualifying 3rd overall, only 1.5 seconds behind 1st place, consequently booking their spot to the Diocesan Carnival where they will represent the

Cumberland Zone. The 800m events followed, the toughest event on the program, but this didn't stop Marisol from running an outstanding race in the 11 Year old girls final. She ran an amazing 13 seconds faster than her 800m race at the school carnival to finish in 4th place. OLMC had seven students qualify for the finals of the 100m and 200m events. Of these seven, we had three students finish in the top four to qualify for the Diocesan Carnival. Congratulations to Jasmine, Isabella and Amiel! The field events saw another three OLMC students qualify for the Diocesan Carnival bringing our grand total of Athletes going to the next level of competition to eight competitors! This is the largest number of students we will have competing in a long time, continuing the rise of Athletics at OLMC. Congratulations to the following students:

The clinic will be run by James Hanson, the Western Sydney NRL Development Officer, and will run for six weeks after school on a Wednesday beginning at 3:15pm.
