SPOTLIGHT ON RE

Children in our school have been involved in deepening their knowledge around the Sacraments, particularly the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism and Reconciliation in Years 1, 2 and 4. Children in Kindergarten have been talking about how much their family loves them and the Scripture story of Jesus being lost in the temple and how worried Mary and Joseph were when they could not find their Son, but how much they loved Him. Ask your child/ren to tell you the story! Students in Stage 3 have been inquiring into the beginnings of our Apostolic Church (what does this mean?) looking at the Creed and the journeys of Peter and Paul. Year 6 have focussed on Stewardship and their responsibility, the children are looking at Pope Francis' letter Laudato Si and their responsibility in not just care of the Earth but their covenant with Christ through their Baptism for being stewards of all creation.

Last week we celebrated Book Week, and what a celebration it was

Monday morning Kindergarten, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 5 students received a visit from the author Ursula Pubosarsky. She shared her writing process, where she gets her ideas and how she develops these ideas into stories. Our students were able to ask many questions as Ursula discussed her popular children titles, The Terrible Plop, Too Many Elephants in This House, The Blue Cat and Tim and Ed.

It was then time for the much anticipated assembly. Students paraded their extremely creative costumes with students and families cheering them on. The teachers also got into the spirit and came dressed as the hungry caterpillar. Some the teachers even presented a Readers' Theatre about a bikie gang who stumble across a library and are immersed in the wonderful literature they find there.



Later in the day, students formed teams of four to participate in a 'Scavenger Hunt' across the school. They visited different classrooms to complete activities and earned points for showing respectful and collaborative behaviours. On Wednesday, Year 3 and Year 5 students were spoilt with a visit from popular author Louise Park.
