

MAI: INTERVIEW NOTES

Once again we will be conducting Mathematics Assessment Interviews with all our children in 2020. We have allocated time on Tuesday 28 January 2020 to begin these interviews. If you are able to bring your child in for an interview on this day, please follow the instructions on the note sent home last Friday. Please note that all children will have their interview within the first four weeks of Term One 2020, so there is no need to worry if you are unable to make an appointment. If you need to cancel an appointment please do so via the school interviews website to open the time up.

SCHOOL UNIFORM AND HAIRCUTS

We ask that children wear full school uniform at all times and for parents' support in ensuring appropriate haircuts upon returning to school at the commencement of 2020 in full Summer uniform.

Haircuts

Boys - Neat and simple haircuts, no undercuts or colouring, no shorter than a number 2, no rat tails or patterns shaved in, cuts should be graduated without obvious difference in length.

Girls - Shoulder length or longer hair must be tied back. No hair colouring is permitted. Hair ties, ribbons and headbands must be white, blue or school uniform pattern. Cultural braided additions must be a natural colour.

(Please note the final decision is at the discretion of the principal)

School Shoes - Many families will be purchasing new shoes for their children, please remember the following. School shoes should be leather or similar, no black sport shoes or slip on shoes. Socks should turn down and visible above the shoes. Shoes should be low heeled with buckles, laces or velcro fastenings. Sport shoes should be mainly white, black or blue (a colour that matches the school sport uniform) Sport socks should be visible above the shoes.

Thank you for your anticipated support in ensuring that your child/ren are ready to commence learning with their equipment in full school uniform upon their return from holidays.



FIRST CHALLENGE




1-4 days read - 1 entry
