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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

Monday was Remembrance Day. Remembrance Day was formerly known as Armistice Day and marked the end of World War I. On the first anniversary of the armistice in 1919, one minute's silence was instituted as a part of commemorative ceremonies. After the end of World War II in 1945, the name of the day was changed to Remembrance Day. This day has come to be a day that we remember those who died during war in the service of their countries.



On Monday, I had the honour of attending the Parramatta RSL Remembrance Day ceremony at Prince Alfred Square with four of our student leaders, Michael, Emily, James and Chloe. We joined service men and women, veterans, local leaders and many students from local schools. It was an opportunity to reflect about those who have served our country and consider the ways that we can serve in our own way. Our student leaders were invited to lay flowers at the base of the cenotaph, which was the focal point of the ceremony.

It is fitting that Remembrance Day falls in November, as November is a month of remembrance for our Catholic Church. On the first of November we celebrate the feast of All Saints and then on the second of November we commemorate All Souls Day. These are the days when we remember the people of extraordinary religious faith alongside people who hold an extraordinary place in our hearts. While each day we remember our loved ones who have passed away, All Souls Day is one where as a faith community we pray collectively for our loved ones.

Year 3 spent a day in Homebush, taking part in fun workshops all day! Here is a snippet of the cool facts we learnt!

Pollinators

We learnt that bees collect nectar from flowers to take back to their hive. We tasted two different types of honey and found out that there are different flavours of honey, depending on the type of tree or plant it comes from. We learnt that if there were no bees to pollinate the flowers and plants, then we would not have all the different fruits and vegetables.

Dairy

We liked milking the cow and seeing how to make butter and cheese. Jersey cows give us milk that is creamier. The most popular type of dairy cow in Australia is the Holstein cow.



Poultry We learnt that chickens can be Pree range, cage Pree or caged. A chicken lays about 300 eggs per year. In the world we eat 55 Million chickens a year.



Fibre

We got to touch the wool and it felt a bit greasy because of the lanolin, which helps protect the sheep from the rain. We learnt how people shear sheep and the process of how the wool goes to the shops to be sold or made into clothes. Wool used to make clothes, blankets, carpet and sheepskin products. Merino is very fuzzy and tangled.

Grain

There are different types of grain, such as wheat, corn, oats, maize, quinoa, barley and millet. There are three parts to a wheat grain: the endosperm, the bran and the germ. We had to grind wheat to make flour. We got to try some foods made from different grains. We learnt that brown bread is healthier than white bread.
