PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

This coming Sunday marks the beginning of a new liturgical year in our church and the commencement of **Advent**. The word Advent comes from the Latin word *Adventus* which means 'coming'. Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation of the coming of Christ into the world which is celebrated in the Nativity at Christmas.

Our Gospel readings this liturgical year come from the Gospel of Matthew. In this week's Gospel we will hear Jesus speaking of the need for readiness and alertness, in relation to the coming of the Kingdom, which is equally suitable for a modern audience when preparing to celebrate once again the coming of Jesus into the world. Jesus is the best expression of the Kingdom that we have yet experienced and we can recognise the alignment that exists between the anticipation of the Kingdom and the anticipation of the Nativity.

The two great feasts of Christianity - the Nativity and Easter - are each preceded by a period of preparation: Advent and Lent. The emphasis of these seasons is on the mental and spiritual preparation to fully enter into one of the great mysteries of faith. In the Nativity, we celebrate God become human; God present in the world in a physical way. Advent is a time to remember the many and varied ways that God continues to be present in the world. We are called to prepare our mind and our hearts for the coming of Jesus.
