
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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

ALL children must be dropped off at the gate. No parent or carer is allowed to enter the front or back playground during morning drop off.

As is the current procedure, parents are asked to move on quickly and engage with our facebook page, where they will find a live streaming of this event. The event will begin at 8:30am and will go until 9am. Students are to wear their normal school uniform. We are so excited and can't wait for Friday morning! Something special in recognition of our families and teachers' efforts will be presented in week 10.



ATTENDANCE - ILLNESS

Parents are reminded that if their child/ren are unable to return to school due to documented medical advice they are to speak with Miss Pirovic immediately. If your child is sick with cold symptoms it is advised that they stay home from school and that parents consult their doctor. If your child appears to be unwell, we will check their temperature and monitor them for a period of time. Parents may be called to collect their child from school.

BAND UPDATE

Band lessons will begin next Tuesday following the time-table from Term One. Parents are asked to help their children remember to bring their instruments and music to school ready for their lessons.

SAFE DRIVING

Well, we can all agree it's the one thing none of us missed, the traffic! Now with us all returned, it's timely that we are reminded of the considerate and patient behaviours needed during pick-up and drop-off times. Parents are asked to follow these practices to increase the flow of traffic.

- 1. Keep the flow of traffic going by moving on quickly;
- 2. If you cannot park and someone is not leaving within half a minute, please continue around the block until the next available parking space;
- 3. If you plan to stay a little longer, maybe to chat with the teacher or try on a uniform, park a little further to allow parents making a quick pick up to get in and out as soon as possible;
- 4. Park on a surrounding street and walk to the school to collect your child;
- 5. If a school bus is coming up the street behind you, keep moving unless you are parking immediately;
- 6. If you park on Bennett St, school side in the morning, you not allowed to move from your car;

Police have been seen passing the school several times during drop off and pick up. We understand that these times of the day are frustrating, however, we have to work together to ensure the safety of the children and all road users.

PE LESSONS AND SPORT DAYS

To help students and parents transition back to regular school routines we thought we'd remind families of the days students must wear their sports uniform. The following schedule indicates the days students in each grade should wear their sport uniforms. Children wear their sport uniform on the day they have Physical Education lessons and their Sport Lesson.

Year 1	Tuesday and Wednesday
Year 2	Wednesday and Thursday

Year 3Gold	Thursday and Friday
Year 4	Tuesday and Thursday
Year 5	Tuesday and Friday





SCHOOL UNIFORMS

The children should now be wearing their full Winter uniform. We request parent support in ensuring that the children are dressed in the correct uniform and are wearing it appropriately. How your children wear their uniform demonstrates pride in themselves and respect for themselves and others. Refer to below for a reminder of our uniform expectations:

Girls Winter Uniform

Boys Winter Uniform

- · School check tunic with pale lemon long sleeve blouse
- School tracksuit jacket and/or jumper
- Navy blue tights or Navy blue socks (ankle or knee). No other leggings or tights can be worn.
- Sport uniforms to be worn on sport days. Students are able to wear the school tracksuit. No leggings to be worn under shorts. Shoes should be predominantly white or a colour that blends with the uniform eg: blue or black.
- Hair ties/ribbons should be in the school check pattern or navy blue. Elastics can be the child's hair colour
- Hair styles should be neat. Shoulder length or longer hair must be tied back. No hair colouring is allowed.

- Navy blue trousers with long sleeved school shirt and gold striped tie, short grey school socks and black shoes.
- School tracksuit jacket and/or jumper
- Sport uniforms to be worn on sport days. Students are able to wear the school tracksuit. No leggings to be worn under shorts. Shoes should be predominantly white or a colour that blends with the uniform eg: blue or black.
- Hair styles should be neat and simple. No undercuts, number one cuts or patterns shaved in. Haircuts should be blended in length and style. No hair colouring is allowed.

With the return of students this week, now is the time to order your winter uniforms if you haven't already. Orders must be placed no later than 4pm on a Wednesday afternoon to be included in the following day's delivery. Parents are reminded to label all uniforms before students wear them for the first time. The second hand uniform shop will be open 2:30pm-3pm this Friday 29th May. Please note that items are \$10 each and the payment method is cash only. If you have any old uniforms still in good condition they can be donated to the second hand uniform shop week.




And We're Back.....

And just like that, our learning gets back on track.




Kindergarten: "We've been learning all about going to Church and that's special. I go to

Year 3: "We have been focusing on visualising using descriptive writing".




Year 4: "Yesterday we learnt about polygons and quadrilaterals. Polygons are any shape with 3 or more sides and
