
Assessment: The understanding of where learners are in an aspect of their learning, at a particular point in time.

Capable: The ability to.


Learner: All students, teachers and community members in the journey of lifelong learning.

In summary, it is all learners (not just students) ability to understand how they are progressing with their learning, at a particular point.

You may want to view this video at home with your child/ren as it highlights that we are all learners and that We Can Learn Anything!



Last week, staff inquired into the skills and dispositions we believe our students need to possess to support them in



flourishing as assessment capable learners. Skills and dispositions are essential as they provide learners with frameworks for thinking, talking and acting as successful learners. Over the next few weeks we will also collect student voice and then once again reflect as a staff. However, part of this process includes you, the families. Families bring a unique, valuable and essential perspective to learning, and we would like to know what skills and dispositions you believe are vital in forming assessment capable learners. Families are encouraged to click on the link and highlight the 5-6 skills they believe are essential for their young learners. This consultative process will ensure that as a community our message is consistent and relentless, supporting our community in knowing what to expect as a learner at OLMC.

Another consultative process that families, teachers and students will be involved in over the next few weeks is 'Tell Them From Me'. This is an annual and anonymous survey which collects data on your experiences of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Just as we want our students to be assessment capable, we must also

demonstrate that mindset. Like any other organisation, we know that we can always improve and are strategic with all of the decisions we make to ensure we have maximum impact on our learners. Knowing the influence we have on your child's and family's lives, your engagement with this is vital as it provides valuable feedback and allows us to continue our commitment of working together in partnership to further improve student learning and wellbeing.


