LATEST COVID ADVICE

This week, further advice and restrictions were announced. This has, and will continue to impact what the rest of 2020 looks like at school. Families need to understand that we do not get to choose which restrictions we follow and which we will bend or ignore, we must follow all advice to ensure the health and safety of all of our students, families, staff and community members. As of today, any student **must not attend school if they are unwell.**

- Students who are absent from school or who have been sent home due to flu like symptoms **must be tested**
- Students **must not return to school until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom free**
- Schools must **sight the negative COVID-19 test result** prior to allowing students to return to school i.e. NSW Health or COVID-19 Testing Centre correspondence (SMS or email or hard copy) and/or a medical certificate must be provided to the school and a record of this kept by the school.
- If your child is being tested and awaiting results, Parents are expected to inform the school so that we can apply a 'Flexible' code for attendance.

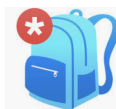
KEEPING UPDATED

FINES ARE COMING - DRIVING AROUND OLMC

On Monday parking inspectors came to inspect the traffic situation around OLMC after a frustrated member of the community made a complaint about traffic banking up on Station Street. Inspectors were very clear about the expectations of drivers waiting for a car spot on Bennett Street, with failure to comply with this road rule resulting in a definite fine. **When turning onto Bennett Street, if a car is not pulling out of a space you CAN NOT sit and wait**, even if the parent is sitting in their car and you think they may move soon, you **MUST** move on. If you sit and wait, even for a few seconds, you are double parking and could be fined. **Drivers must drive safely and keep the traffic flowing**. While we have encouraged families to park further away if they will be at the school longer, as a courtesy, there is no time limit for drivers when parking on Bennett Street after 9:30am. **All drivers must obey the road rules.**
