PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

Each week our staff gathers on a Tuesday afternoon to engage in professional learning. Yesterday, Mrs Haddad shared with us a reflection on Pope Francis' most recent encyclical '**Fratelli Tutti**'. An encyclical is a letter from the Pope to followers and non-followers of Christ. The title of the encyclical translates as '**Brothers All**'. In this letter Pope Francis talks about the ideas of fraternity and social friendship as the ways to build a better, more just and peaceful world, with the contribution of all: people and institutions. With an emphatic confirmation of a 'no' to war and to globalized indifference.

As Pope Francis was writing this encyclical the covid pandemic began to spread across the world. This global health emergency has helped demonstrate that "**no one can face life in isolation and that the time has come to dream as a single human family in which we are brothers and sisters all.**" The concepts that Pope Francis is highlighting in his encyclical connect closely with Matthew's Gospel from last Sunday...

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

As Catholics we strive to live our lives guided by the principles demonstrated by Jesus in the Gospels. We as individuals have an impact on our wider world if we ensure the ideals of loving God, loving our neighbours, demonstrating fraternity and friendship to **all**. We all know what these ideals look like and mean, yet we are still challenged to fully live them in action, with our Head, Heart and Hands. Let us at OLMC strive to truly live as '**Fratelli Tutti**'!
