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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE


Dear Parents,

When the Year Six students attended camp recently they celebrated Mass with Fr Martinho. The focus of this liturgy was:

"Who is My Neighbour?"

The students focused on the parable of the Good Samaritan and were challenged to consider who was the better neighbour. They were also asked to consider who their neighbour is and how they treat them. This week's Gospel readings call back to the concept of Neighbour. We will reflect on the story of God speaking to Moses and telling him to "Love thy neighbour as yourself" and then in the Gospel the theme is reiterated with the words "Love your enemies".

The concept of loving your neighbour is one of our greatest challenges as Catholics. Some of our neighbours are our friends who we are quite happy to demonstrate our love for. While others are strangers or even enemies and it is more challenging to show love towards these people. These Scriptures were written at a time when it was considered the norm to respond with retribution towards someone who wrongs you. However, God through Moses, and then through Jesus, is calling us to respond differently, to turn the other cheek and offer forgiveness and prayer. What an enormous challenge for us mere mortals!



You might like to discuss these concepts with your family this week. Share with each other ideas about how you might be able to live God's call to 'Love your neighbour'.

BENNETT STREET PARKING

that....


- Can articulate what they are learning and why
