



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

This Sunday marks the fourth Sunday of Lent. The Gospel reading this week tells the story of the miracle of Jesus healing the Blind Man. When Jesus saw the blind man, he spat on the ground to make a paste and then rubbed it over the man's eyes. Jesus then sent the man to the Pool of Siloam, a ritual bath, where he washed himself to find that his sight had been restored.

The man was then taken to the Pharisees who, being blinded by the laws of the Jewish rituals, failed to see Jesus as God, but saw him as a sinner because he had broken the laws of the Sabbath. The blind man in contrast saw the truth very clearly and rebuked the Pharisees because they failed to see the truth of Jesus before their very own eyes. The blind man, despite his physical blindness, was open to Jesus' actions and an encounter with Truth himself.



We all have blind spots in our thinking - an inner Pharisee - obscuring our understanding of the truth and of reality. Instead the truth we are capable of knowing is replaced with partial truths, because it would be uncomfortable to acknowledge the whole truth about ourselves, our mistakes or our circumstances. So we hide away from these truths and ignore the things we may need to address. When we do this we miss the opportunity to know the great truth of God's love for us and His desire to heal and to help us love God and all his people.

In reflecting on this miracle, I think of how the past few weeks with the fear of the Covid-19 virus has caused some people to become blind to their neighbours. In the panic to stockpile products, we are forgetting to reach out to others in need. In the anxiety of protecting ourselves, people have become blind to the vulnerable.

Let us consider:

In what ways have I been blind like the Pharisees?

How can I be open to Jesus so as to see the love and light of God more clearly?

Children in Kindy to Year 2 will read or experience 30 books from the challenge list with their class over the course of the challenge period. CHANGES DUE TO COVID-19

To ensure the safety of our school community, we are required to follow the directions of NSW Health and the advice from Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta. On Monday afternoon we received further advice of measures we are required to put in place. Currently, these measures include:

- No external providers are permitted to enter the school site - eg: AFL, author visits
- Any event that will draw community members into the school will be cancelled - eg: assemblies, open days, school community celebrations
- Our students will not attend excursions, even within the local community.

School Closure

As of today schools are remaining open. Our school staff and system are preparing for the possible closure of schools. Until the decision to close schools is made we will continue to operate as normal. There is a great deal of speculation and discussion which is creating anxiety amongst our local and wider community. Advice is received by schools on a daily and sometimes hourly basis. We will act on the advice accordingly and communicate to parents when there are changes. Our primary focus is always on the wellbeing of the children, keeping them calm with routines that are as normal as possible while reflective of the safe practices we need to use. We would ask our parent community to be mindful of each other and be measured in our conversations in order to not create further anxiety or distress. We appreciate the patience of parents as we navigate this unusual time together.

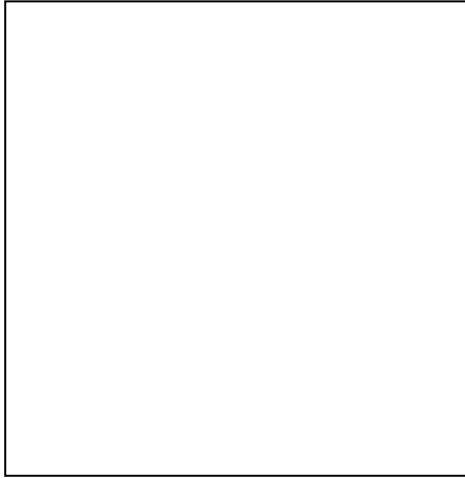
