

STUDENT ILLNESS - COVID RESTRICTIONS STILL APPLY

During the past week we have had a number of children who have come to school and been sent home as they are unwell. We are still required to operate under the protocols that were advised during 2020. We understand that some children may suffer from seasonal hay fever or allergies and these symptoms can present as covid symptoms. If this is the case for your child, parents are asked to obtain a clearance letter from their doctor for their child to attend school. Currently,

- No student is to attend school if they are unwell. This includes a runny nose or sore throat.
- Students who are absent from school with flu like symptoms, or, who have been sent home because they have flu-like symptoms must have a COVID-19 test
- Students are not able to return to school until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom free •
- A negative COVID-19 test result must be provided to the school before a student can come back to school. The test results can be a NSW Health or COVID-19 Testing Centre letter, SMS or email and/or a medical certificate
- These same protocols apply to school staff.

We also understand these processes may be frustrating, however in order to protect the health and safety of all we are required to follow them. Parents are also asked to be respectful to school staff who call to ask for a child to be collected. We are not doctors and take into consideration what a child is saying and what the class teacher has observed, however, in the end we must follow the procedures expected of us.

KINDERGARTEN 2022 ENROLMENTS

The 2022 Kindergarten enrolment period will commence on the 1st March 2021. Enrolment packs will be available from this date for prospective parents to AR collect from the office and should be submitted by **THURSDAY 1 APRIL**. Due to current restrictions we will be holding three Open Afternoons for families to attend. These are scheduled for 12th and 26th March and 7th May 2020, beginning at 4pm



UNIFORM ORDERING

Please note that the cut off for any uniform orders placed is now 4pm on Tuesdays. If you place your order before the cut off, it will be delivered to school on Thursday.

SCHOOL FEES

All 2021 school fees accounts have now been mailed by CEDP. A note has been sent home to all families this week explaining the details of your account. Term 1 school fees are payable by 18 March. Please remember to accept your Flexible Payment Plan online at https://www.parra.catholic.edu.au/fpp by 16 March. Should you have any gueries regarding your account please contact Maree Murphy in the school office.

MISSING OR OVERDUE BOOKS

If your child has any class readers or library books that have been at home for a while, they are most likely overdue. Having multiple overdue books may prevent your child from borrowing and prevents other



children from enjoying the books you have at home. Students may return their books any day of the week by placing them in the returns tub situated at the front desk in the Library.

MEET THE TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Due to restrictions, we are not able to have **ANY** children onsite whilst parents are onsite, this includes the children who attend OLMC. If you have a morning appointment please enter through the school office. For those who have an appointment between **3:20pm-3:50pm** your child/children may accompany you to your meeting or wait on the pick up line. Any other times **MUST BE CHILD FREE.** We know this is an inconvenience, however, we must follow the strict guidelines provided to us to ensure the safety of our community.

Over the next few weeks, parents will be receiving information regarding 'Parent Compass Portal'. The Parent Compass Portal will facilitate effective communication between home and school and streamline a range of processes, making it more convenient for our families and staff.

Every family will be required to access this portal, with parents being able to review their child/ren's attendance, provide explanations for periods of absence and update family contact details. A letter will soon be sent via email to all enrolled families with your login details for Compass. We will let you know when this occurs so that you can keep an eye out in your inbox, spam and junk mail.
